
STANDARDS OF PROBABILITY AND ASSESSMENT OF FUTURE RISK

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International protection determinations are conducted with a two-stage approach. Stage one is the gathering of relevant information, the identification of the material facts of the application and the determination on the Balance of Probabilities which of the Applicant's statements and other evidence can be accepted. Stage two is the analysis of the well-founded fear of persecution and real risk of serious harm.



The chart above is representational only. It is meant to give a simplified view of how 'standards of probablity' and 'assessments of future risk' operate. There are many such 'standards' but this chart seeks to identify only the more common ones. The numerical values are inserted only for scale purposes and do not represent a 'numerical' factor which each level should reach.
